It provides all sorts of audio-visual equipments commonly used for teaching at school level.


Psychological Lab

- Spacious and airy classrooms & lush green ambience.



Rules and Regulations:

The students studying at D.A.V. will be embarking upon professional life in due course of time. In order to foster a sense of responsibility and discipline in our students a special code of conduct is expected of them.

1. Students must respect all teachers and authorities. They must be courteous and polite to everyone including their fellow students.
2. The property of the Institute has to be taken care of. Any damage done to the property will have to be compensated.
3. Attendance in all activities and functions of the Institute is compulsory.
4. All the students must observe punctuality. We are very particular about attendance in the morning assembly. Students who are late for assembly will be marked absent for the whole day.
5. Students are supposed to submit leave applications for their absence. Minimum of 75% attendance is compulsory in order to appear for the examinations. We shall debar the students for examinations who fall short of the prescribed attendance. In case of illness, students are supposed to submit a medical certificate and fitness certificate along with the application. Spurious certificate shall be rejected. Only a limited number of medical leave shall be granted on whatsoever medical grounds.
A fine of Rs. 50/- per day shall be imposed on the students failing to submit/substantiate his/her leave. The imposition of the fine is a tool to bring about regularity in attendance. This will be applied to all the students of B.A., B.B.A., B.C.A., and B.Ed. .
6. There is no provisions of half day leave for students.
7. Dress code : There will be a uniform for students at the college campus.
Boys : Dark Gray colour trousers, white shirt, dark blue colour tie with College emblem embroidered on it and navy blue coat/sweater.
Girls : Dark Gray kurta, white salwar, white dupatta and navy blue coat/sweater.
8. **Compulsory half-yearly internal examination and monthly test will be taken of all the B.A.-I, II, & III students. It will be compulsory for all the students, it is just to ascertain their preparation and to introduce the university final examination pattern. Those students who do not appear in exam will be fined Rs.300/- each.**
9. Rebate in tuition fee for B.A. classes is only for those students who are not getting fee reimbursement from Distt. Social Welfare Deptt.

General Instructions:

All entries should be legibly written in capital letters. Incorrect or incomplete admission forms shall not be processed. Merely filling up of admission form dose not guarantee admission to the Institute.


